The Bible speaks about peace in many passages of Scripture. Throughout the Old Testament, the word "Shalom" is used meaning *peace, wholeness and well being*.

Peace is described in the Bible, not as a place or condition, but ultimately as a relationship with God.

II. EXPERIENCE WHAT PEACE DOES

PEACE HELPS YOU:

▶ Cope With Your Conflicts

So often, our lives are stirred and stained by conflicts in our relationships. And much of that conflict starts with us. It is something happening inside of us.

"But what about the feuds and struggles that exist among you—where to you suppose they come from? Can't you see that they arise from conflicting desires for pleasure within yourselves? You crave for something and don't get it; you are murderously jealous of what you can't possess yourselves; you struggle and fight with one another." James 4:1-2

▶ Cultivate Contentment in Your Life

Discontentment brings disruption and disturbance to your life. Contentment is not a matter of *things*, but of *thankfulness* and *trust*.

Remember,

1. God loves you and you are valuable to Him.
2. God will meet your needs: "Give us this day our daily bread. . ."

► **Combat Your Concerns**

III. UNDERSTAND HOW PEACE COMES
